Vignola was born in London, England in 1945 shortly before the end of World War II. She arrived in the United States at almost three years of age. She obtained a Bachelor's Degree in Arts from Hunter College, 1967. Subsequently, she received a Master's Degree in Education from William Paterson University where she is presently employed as an Adjunct Professor.

After settling in the Succasunna, New Jersey area, she taught mathematics in the Roxbury School District for 25 years. Janet received the Teacher of the Year Award at the Eisenhower Middle School in 1994 and the Best Practice Award from the State of New Jersey in 1999. She has two daughters and five grandchildren.

Janet has done a considerable amount of public speaking on various subjects during her professional career. She is eminently qualified to speak on the subject of the Holocaust, not only because of her public speaking experience, but also because she is a first generation descendant of Holocaust survivors.
